ABOUT CCBF

The Children's Cancer & Blood Foundation (CCBF) supports the pioneering and lifesaving work of the Division of Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at New York-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell Medical Center. We treat thousands of children with an array of pediatric blood diseases and cancers. No child is ever turned away for services, regardless of his or her ability to pay. We have an incredible group of doctors, scientists and staff committed to finding cures and improving quality of life.

We have a more than fifty-year history of combining scientific and clinical research to develop new drugs and therapies. Some examples include:

Our doctors are leading a study to identify how bone marrow stem cells spread, and contribute to tumor growth and metastases. They are looking at childhood leukemia, lymphoma, breast, colon and lung cancer. The New England Journal of Medicine recently published 2 studies showing that new drug treatments pioneered by CCBF doctors successfully decreased bleeding in patients with Immune Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP) and other platelet disorders. In a study published in Blood, CCBF researchers found that a chemical compound currently being used in clinical trials to treat leukemia reduced the size of the spleen in mice and allowed it to produce normal red blood cells. If successful in humans, it would be a major breakthrough for patients with thalassemia (Cooley's Anemia).

Proceeds from this benefit will ensure that children and their families receive the most advanced, comprehensive care available.






